What is Kids Volley?

Kids Volley is a program aimed at primary school and early secondary school aged children to teach them the fundamentals of volleyball. Kids Volley is delivered through Spikezone, Volleyball Australia's entry-level Volleyball program for Kids aged between 5 and 13.

Spikezone increases participation opportunities for primary and early secondary school aged students.

- It is a fun and energetic activity.
- It is a great team sport.
- It increases coordination and socialisation skills.
- It is a non-contact gender equal sport.
- All equipment is provided, players just need to bring themselves and a drink bottle.

Types of Programs

1. The 'Learn to Play' component of Spikezone is a series of skill and game-related coaching sessions designed to introduce players to Volleyball in a fun and active way. This program provides a fun and active session that will offer participants a positive first experience of the sport.
2. 'Spikezone Play' challenges players to take their game to the next level! Players form teams and test their new skills against others in weekly competitions.

Spikezone Modifications

The modifications for Spikezone that are different from Volleyball include:

- A smaller sized court (13 metres by 6.5 metres)
- A lower net height (2 metres)
- A softer and lighter ball
- Less players on the court
- Slight changes to the rules
- Spikezone can be played on any surface – indoors, beach, or grass.

Kids Volley Centre Benefits and Requirements

What is a Kids Volley Centre?

Kids Volley Centres are the local venues for learning and playing Spikezone Volleyball activities. Spikezone activities can be held at a local school hall or indoor leisure centre, a park, or a beach. In order to run and manage an official Kids Volley Centre, Centres must be an Approved school or a Volleyball Club/Association.

Benefits of Approved Kids Volley Centre status

The benefits of being an Approved Centre include:

1. Ongoing development of community partnerships and networks
2. Access to a large participation base and talent identification pool
3. Access to potential new coaches and referees
4. Revenue generation
5. Centre promoted on the Volleyball WA and the Volleyball Australia Official Spikezone website

All Approved Kids Volley Centres are provided with:

1. Volleyball WA officer support, including:
 - a. Business planning
 - b. Workplace Health and Safety guidance
 - c. Coach and Referee recruitment
 - d. Coordinator mentoring
2. Generic promotional literature and marketing support
3. Reduced price Kids Volley equipment
4. Kids Volley template package (e.g. Attendance Sheets, Certificates, Lesson Plans etc).
5. Endorsement and promotion through the following channels:
 - Volleyball WA website, social media platforms and related promotional material
 - Partner networks (where appropriate), including educational institutions
 - Volleyball WA Teacher workshops and conferences
 - Where to Next location as provided to schools and students who attend Volleyball WA Sporting Schools or clinic sessions
6. Identification of key interschool Primary School Volleyball tournaments in Spikezone areas for active promotion

VWA Kids Volley Centre requirements

1. Kids Volley Centres must be a VWA Gold, Platinum or Platinum Regional member affiliated club/association/school
2. All Coaches must have a minimum of Level 1 Foundation coaching accreditation and a valid Working With Children Check.
3. Each participant must be a current Volleyball WA member. This also ensures that they are covered by the VWA Personal Accident Insurance.
4. Purchase/use of Spikezone Kits and Nets.
5. Purchase/use of Official Spikezone balls (Mikasa SKV5).
6. Addition of Kids Volley-Spikezone logo to club/organisations shirt and promotional material.
7. Payment to VWA will be based on the requirements of the specific centre. These payments could include: Centre fee, Membership fee, CRM fee, Other as agreed upon by both Volleyball WA and the Centre.

*The CRM fee will only be incurred if the centre chooses to use the Volleyball WA Membership Portal to enrol participants.

Kids Volley Centre Application

Kids Volley Centre Application Process

For a club/organisation/business to become a Kids Volley Centre they must be a member of their State Volleyball Association. The process identified below will be followed:

- Complete the relevant Application Form
- Meeting held between the Volleyball WA Schools and Junior Development Coordinator and Centre to complete the Kids Volley Centre Agreement.
- Completion of the Kids Volley Centre Checklist prior to operation.
- Submission of the relevant Volleyball WA Membership Application if the Centre is not a current Volleyball WA Gold, Platinum or Platinum Regional Affiliate.
- Provision of a Kids Volley Centre Certificate, logos and any promotional material from VWA/VA within the first term of becoming endorsed.

Centres will be notified of any changes in requirements that may occur and offered support to submit the amendments required.

De-Accreditation Process

Kids Volley Centres will be supported to meet the minimum operating standards by the end of their first term in operation. If these standards are not met during this time frame, Volleyball WA will evaluate the progress made and may de-accredit the Kids Volley Centre.

If any affiliation or Approved Centre requirements are breached, Volleyball WA will withdraw the organisation from the program and it will take all steps, in its absolute discretion, it considers necessary to address the issue of non-compliance.

If a Kids Volley Centre wishes to withdraw from the program they must notify Volleyball WA in writing, via participation@volleyballwa.com.au.

Confidentiality Statement

Volleyball WA will not use or disclose any confidential information relating to the Centre, or any of its related bodies corporate, joint ventures, or customers, unless:

- the law requires the information to be disclosed;
- VWA has the obtained prior written consent from the Approved Centre.

VWA will not, during the Program or at any time after the completion of the Program, use or attempt to use confidential information in any matter, which may cause loss or injury to the Centre. VWA will take all reasonable steps to prevent the disclosure of confidential information by third parties.
