<p>2 Business Arising</p>	<p>2.1 Welcome CM opened the meeting and welcomed the 2020 panel attendees to the first meeting. DS then readout the 2020 Lead Volley Panel Terms of Reference. The panel agreed to the references and proceeded to discuss preferences for communication and panel dates, the panel selected Facebook messenger and agreed to the proposed dates.</p> <p>2.2 Good Leadership CM walked the panel members through a discussion around good leadership. Inspirational <p>DS noted that these values would be tabled at the upcoming VWA Staff meeting and will be distributed to all Volleyball committee meetings for discussion.</p> <p>2.3 Objectives & Key Results DS lead the group through an hour and a half Objective and Key Result brainstorming session. The panel split into pairs and identified current problems the sport is facing and potential solutions they could deliver. Each pair then presented their findings to the group, highlighting the rationale behind their selections (SEE APPENDIX A).
